


Pick & Mix

- 2:1/Dyad
- Split placements
- Learning environments/Collaborative Learning Approach
- Extended Days
- TECS placements



2:1/Dyad

- 2 students to 1 educator
- This can be scaled up to include more students
- Split placements



Learning Environments/Collaborative Learning Approach

- An extension of 2:1/3:1 model
- A whole team/ward take responsibility for a group of students and the whole team is part of their learning environment



Extended Days

- Ward/community based
- Student follows a 12 hour shift pattern
- 7-10 ward
- 10-4 therapy/AHP team
- 4-7 ward



Technology Enabled Care Service(TECS) Placements

- Remote service delivery
- Student 'dialling' into consultations
