Find out about low calorie diet programme for your patients with Type II diabetes. What is it, what are the benefits and how to refer.

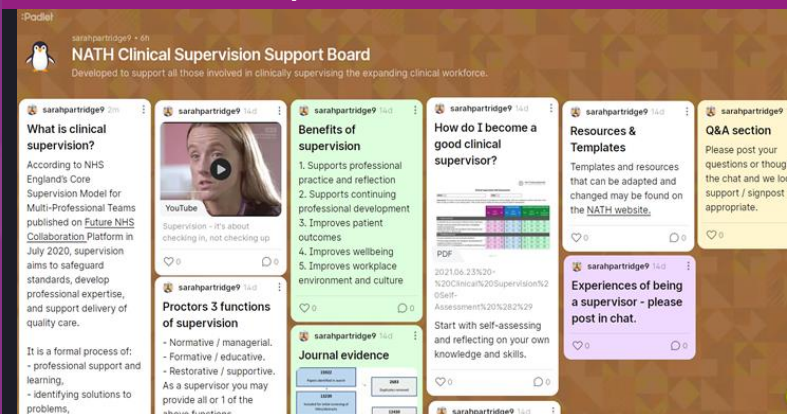
[Fit Notes - Hints and Tips! \(28 Nov\)](#)
